Small Beginnings

In Mark 4:1-34 we have a collection of parables, most of which deal with the growth of seed. They serve as a commentary on what has been happening in Jesus' proclamation of the kingdom.

The prophet Ezekiel foretold that God would take a twig from the top of the cedar and plant it in Zion. Under God's protective power that twig would grow into a great cedar. Thus Ezekiel dreamed that God would transplant the exiled people of Israel back to the land of their fathers. He glimpsed a future son of David whose kingdom would be universal.

The promise is fulfilled in Jesus who ushers in the kingdom of God. The parables of the seed that grows by itself and the mustard seed were meant to encourage the early Church which was worried about the slow growth of the kingdom. They were telling the disciples to be patient, to trust, and not to expect instant results. Through the power of God, from small and insignificant beginnings the kingdom will grow into something great.

Each Saturday the Legion of Mary meets in the Parish Library from 6:30pm.




The group focuses on praying the Rosary and other Marian devotions. Weekly visitation of local care homes and praying together with our brothers and sisters in need are among our many outreach activities.

National Indigenous Peoples Day

June 21 is a time for all Canadians to celebrate more than the arrival of the Summer Solstice – National Indigenous Peoples Day should be a moment when Christians take time to stop and reflect on our past history. More importantly, how will we live into a future of increased respect and justice for Indigenous peoples of this land.

As part of our commitment to renewal and reconciliation with Indigenous sisters and brothers on this land, we will do Land Acknowledgement next weekend before Masses. This small but significant gesture, an act of reconciliation that recognizes the traditional territories of Indigenous peoples and honors their enduring connection to the land. As noted by the Archdiocese of Vancouver, land acknowledgement is a way to deepen reconciliation efforts in our parish.

During his Papal visit in Canada Pope Francis invited us to foster a spirit of healing and reconciliation.

For Indigenous peoples, "land is not a commodity but rather a gift from God and from their ancestors who rest there, a sacred space with which they need to interact if they are to maintain their identity and values" (Pope Francis, Laudato si, n. 146). Land acknowledgement reflects our faith's teachings to respect creation and uphold human dignity.

The Church has doctrine relating to the theology of creation, teaching us that creation is a gift from God the Creator to all peoples. The Indigenous practice of respect for the land is a beautiful tradition that recognizes land as a gift. When we acknowledge the land and the people, we are not making a political statement, we are recognizing a mutual spiritual truth that unites us and draws us into a deeper understanding of God our Creator.

Let us embrace this journey with open hearts and minds, guided by our faith and dedication to building a loving and just community.

Our stained-glass windows require special care and attention. These windows face numerous threats to their preservation:

- † The weight of the glass and leaded mullions can cause structural strain over time, risking damage to the windows.
- Rust on the heavy steel frames supporting the windows jeopardizes their stability and longevity.
- **†** Exposure to sunlight fades the vibrant colors.
- Harsh weather conditions, including heavy rain and temperature fluctuations accelerates deterioration.


