Preparing the way for the Lord

The first reading is a message of hope and consolation addressed to the exiles in Babylon. Humanly speaking, at that time there was little ground for hope. Yet the prophet assures his people that God is about to come to their aid, and will lead them back to their own land in a new exodus. Even though the actual return from exile fell short of the glowing picture painted here, Isaiah's words point the way to the messianic era.

This leads into the Gospel. Like a new Elijah, John appears in the desert and announces the coming of the redeemer - Jesus, the Christ and Son of God. Both reading issue a call to repentance: 'Prepare a way for the Lord."

In the second reading Peter is talking about the second coming. The reason for the Lord's delay is to give everybody an opportunity to repent.

Liturgical Celebrations:

Tuesday - Our Lady of Guadalupe (feast)

This memorial commemorates the apparitions of the Blessed Virgin in 1531 at Tepeyac, on the outskirts of Mexico City. Our Lady appeared four times, twice to aboriginal convert Juan Diego, with whom she left orders to build a church and an imprint of her image on a cloak. In 1946 Pius XII named her a patron of the Americas.

National Day of Prayer in Solidarity with Indigenous Peoples:

The National Day of Prayer in Solidarity with Indigenous Peoples is celebrated on December 12 every year, on the feast day of Our Lady of Guadalupe, patroness of the Americas, who appeared to a humble native peasant, Juan Diego, in Mexico in 1531. The Canadian Catholic Aboriginal Council celebrates this day for prayer, solidarity and reconciliation, by issuing an annual message honouring Aboriginal people who were inspired by their Catholic faith.

Cor - Men's Prayer Reflection



December 31st we need to fulfill our Sunday obligation (including Saturday 5:00pm). **January 1**st Solemnity of Mary Mother of God – Holy Day of Obligation.

In short – "one Mass cannot count for both Sunday and the Christmas or New Year's obligation" RCAV 2023
